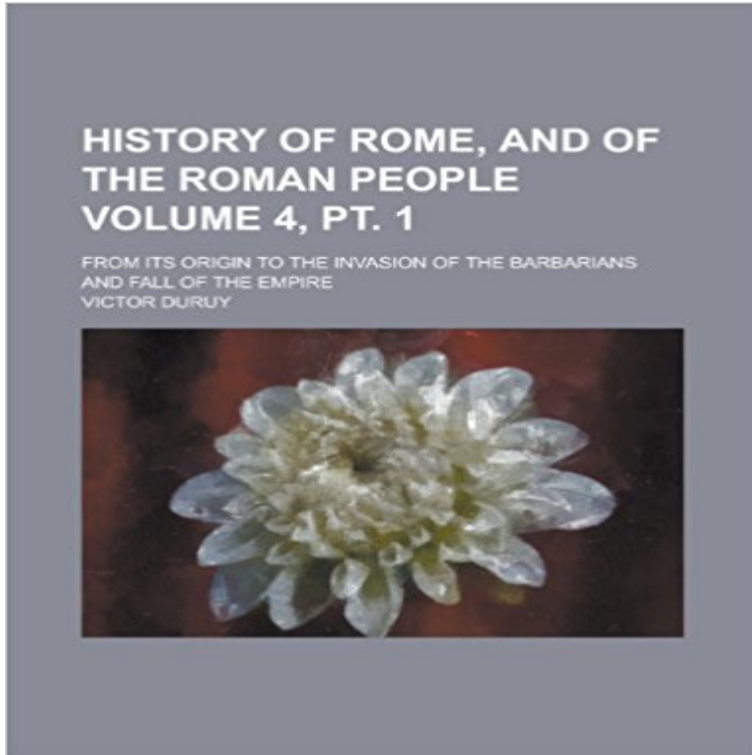

Suetonius, who refers to this measure (Octav. 46), seems to say that only the decurions to the number of one hundred in each city, had been indirectly elected by the popular assembly, the right which they received from Augustus constituted a sort of suffrage by two grades, which is not without analogy with the procedure by which French senators and consular judges are elected. This attempt at organization of universal suffrage in Italy, combined with the provincial representation,--of which we shall speak later,--might have produced the happiest results, uniting by free institutions the various parts of the Empire. But this solution of the political problem, which for a moment seemed possible, was quickly lost to sight; the Emperors knew not how to develop these fruitful germs, or willingly suffered them to perish. of the twentyeight colonies founded by Augustus had this advantage; but it is certain that those of the municipia obtained the same privilege, since he affirms that the Emperor sought to render Italy almost the equal of Rome in rights and honors. 1 The admission to the curia was through a magistracy, and it was the public assembly which elected the magistrates; but it was obligatory to retain the ex-magistrates on the list of senators prepared every five years by the quinquennialcs.
